



*Robert F. Lute II Endowed Scholarship established September 30, 1993, with \$20,000

Lute was a teacher, lawyer and accountant and had a love for young people and a tremendous respect for education. The foundation became a way for him to unite the two. "Education was very important to both of us," Kathy Lute said. "Robert knew that education was necessary and not just any type of education. He felt that students needed brawn and brains. He discussed it with me before his death. He wanted money put into a good foundation." Lute's father, Robert Sr., and Kathy, Lute's widow, established an endowed scholarship in Lute's name after his death.

*Vance Uden

Endowed Scholarship established September 8, 2009, with \$10,000

Vance Uden was a long-time Black Angus breeder from Franklin, Nebraka. He owned and operated TC Ranch which produced some of the breed's leading genetics. Vance earned many awards and was known world wide for cattle while always striving to produce herd sires that would improve the Angus breed. He was a strong supporter of youth and never



established May 15, 1995, with \$20,000





*Bill Heller Endowed Scholarship established October 14, 1996, with \$20,000






Ron & Shirley Huss Endowed Scholarship

Ron and Shirley Huss established this endowed scholarship account to provide an annual scholarship of at least \$1,000 to a student at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln majoring in Animal Science and preparing for a career in agriculture. Preference will be given to applicants whose course of study focuses on beef production.





Bill Pullen Endowed Scholarship established in December 2012, with \$25,000

Bill's Volume Sales and Service, owner Bill Pullen, of Central City, Nebraska, was awarded The Friend of the Foundation Award at the 2012 NC Convention. Bill has served as one of the main sponsors for the Foundation's primary fundraiser, the Retail Value Steer Challenge since inception and has donated a steer each year also. After receiving his Friend of the Foundation award, Bill announced he was contributing \$25,000 to the Foundation, this became the Bill Pullen Endowed Scholarship. This endowed scholarship will provide an annual scholarship of at least \$1,000.

*Colonel Melvin Huss Endowed Scholarship established in December 2012, with \$25,000

Colonel Melvin Huss was a well-known auctioneer, cattleman and livestock market owner. Huss owned and operated the Lexington and Kearney Livestock Markets. Endowed Scholarship established in 2007, with \$6,000

The Nebraska Cattlemen Beef Pit Scholarship was established by the Beef Pit Committee to provide funds to junior or senior undergraduate students and/or graduate students enrolled full time in a Nebraska college or university studying meat and/or food science. This account was fully funded in 2010 with Beef Pit proceeds.

*Todd Ricenbaw Endowed Scholarship established in 2016



Steve Bohr started the golf tournament as a fundraising event while serving as Chairman of the Nebraska Cattlemen PAC Committee, with help from Wes Nelson.



*Bill Briggs Family Endowed Scholarship established in 2016, with \$26,000

Carole Briggs and her family established the Bill Briggs Family Memorial Scholarship Account remembering their husband and father, Bill Briggs, and showcasing the impact the Briggs family has had on the beef industry in Nebraska and Bill's lifelong career in the livestock feeding business. This endowed scholarship account will provide at least a \$1,000 scholarship to a junior or senior level student enrolled at a Nebraska college or university majoring in a beef industry related field and preparing for a career in the beef industry. Preference shall be given to a student with a GPA of at least 2.75.



Jim & *Helen Gran Endowed Scholarship established in 2016, with \$25,000

Jim Gran established the Jim and Helen Gran Endowed Scholarship Account to honor his late wife Helen and his contributions to the Beef Industry in Nebraska. Both were lifelong ranchers and strong advocates for the Nebraska Beef Industry working locally and on the state level in various leadership positions. This endowed scholarship account will provide a scholarship of at least \$1,000 to a sophomore level student at NCTA majoring in an area of production agriculture and preparing for a career in production agriculture.

Shari was active in the Nebraska Cattlewomen. the Nebraska Cattlemen Foundation and was instrumental in organizing the first Nebraska Cattlemen Ball. This account will award scholarships to students residing in Nebraska, majoring in animal science, feedlot management and/or range management. Students must be involved in student organizations related to their field of study. Students much have a 3.3 GPA and preference will be given to those with cattle industry involvement.

Western Nebraska Agriculture Scholarship Endowed Scholarship established in 2021 with \$25,000

The Western Nebraska Agriculture Scholarship will be awarded to students pursuing an education following high school at an accredited higher learning institution in Nebraska, Colorado, Wyoming and/or South Dakota and majoring in agriculture. Students must have a home address located in the Mountain Time Zone in Nebraska. Preference will be given to students attending a two-year institution, community colleges, trade school and/or Chadron State College in Chadron, Nebraska.


UNL Animal Science Scholarship Winners

History

The Nebraska Beef Industry Endowment was established in December 2009. It will provide grants to beef industry-related research and/ or teaching positions at Nebraska post-secondary educational institutions. This award will serve as a thank you and an incentive to those professors/instructors that are providing cutting edge research and/or student instruction in a beef industry related area. This grant will help fund valuable research that might not occur otherwise or allow the continuation of research already being conducted that might not continue because of lack of funding and/ or reward a professor/instructor for outstanding educational instruction to their students.

Since 1968, the Nebraska Cattlemen Foundation has supported the beef industry by financially supporting research and educational projects/programs. Early on the Foundation was instrumental in prompting research in the area of calf-scours and center pivot irrigation and more recently providing funding for the new research feedlot at the Panhandle Research Center in Scottsbluff and the new educational facilities at the Nebraska College of Technical Agriculture in Curtis. Funding scholarships has always been important for the Foundation with thousands of dollars in scholarships awarded to hundreds of students from numerous endowed scholarships accounts and other sources.

The Nebraska Cattlemen Foundation established the Nebraska Beef Industry Professorship of Animal Science at UNL in December 1994 with \$200,000. This fund allows an annual stipend of \$10,000 to be awarded to a worthy professor with the University of Nebraska College of Agriculture and Natural Resources.

The Nebraska Cattlemen Foundation wanted to duplicate that effort and create a fund that would not be limited just to UNL, but benefit a post-secondary educational institution and/ or teaching position any where in our great state of Nebraska, thus the Nebraska Beef Industry Endowment was created. The board plans to grant up to \$5,000 annually to an outstanding professor/instructor.

The Nebraska Beef Industry Endowment was endowed with \$100,000. The Nebraska Cattlemen Foundation board of directors hopes others will see the vital importance of this endowed account and contribute. As the endowed account grows, more grants will be awarded to professors/ instructors and/or research projects that benefit the beef industry, especially the beef industry in Nebraska.

Nebraska Range & Conservation Endowment



Dr. Mitchell Stephenson

Dr. Mitch Stephenson is an Associate Professor and Range Management Specialist with the University of Nebraska - Lincoln stationed at the Panhandle Research, Extension, and Education Center in Scottsbluff, Nebraska. His research is focused on understanding how grazing management decisions influence livestock production, grazing behavior, plant communities, and soil health in the central and western Great Plains. Current research includes studies evaluating the grazing distribution and behavior of beef cows on Sandhills rangelands, timing and intensity of grazing on sandhill sub-irrigated meadow systems, plant community variability in the NE Sandhills, use of virtual fencing and other precision livestock management tools for defined objectives.

Stephenson receives a \$5,000 grant.

History

The Nebraska Cattlemen Foundation created the Nebraska Range and Conservation Endowment in 2011. This endowment will provide grants to range management and conservation research and teaching positions at Nebraska post-secondary educational institutions. This award will serve as a thank you and an incentive to those professors/instructors that are providing cutting edge research and/ or student instruction in a range management and conservation related area.

This endowment was created from one-half the net proceeds of the 2010-2011 Retail Value Steer Challenge. The Nebraska Cattlemen Foundation voted to move enough money from the general account to fully endow the Nebraska Range & Conservation Endowment at \$100,000 at their September 17, 2013, board meeting.

Nebraska Beef Cattle Industry Professorship

The Nebraska Beef Cattle Industry Professorship of Animal Science at UNL was established in December 1994 with \$200,000. This fund allows an annual stipend of \$10,000 to be awarded to a worthy professor within the University of Nebraska College Agriculture and Natural Resources. Dr. Chris Calkins was awarded this stipend from 1995 – 2011. The Nebraska Cattlemen Foundation proudly awarded Dr. Galen Erickson this stipend in 2012 for his cutting edge research with feedlot rations, especially the use of distillers grain and other by-product feed sources in finishing diets for beef cattle. Erickson will receive this award through July 1, 2027.

UNL Feedlot Management Course

The Foundation funds a grant each year since 1997 to support the UNL Feedlot Management Course. This fund was established with \$20,000 from the Merck-Merial Generations of Excellence funds. This course is an intensive eight week study on and off campus that provides students an opportunity to get real life experience in the feedlot industry, including internships at feedlots.

Charitable Gift Planning Helps You Give Back

A Lincoln couple says they've chosen to give 20% of their estate back to charitable causes. Others are being encouraged to make charitable gift planning a priority to support greater Nebraska.

For Chuck and Janel Hibberd, deciding to do some charitable gift planning just made sense. "We both come from families of parents who are engaged in the community and active in philanthropy," Chuck Hibberd said. "They set a tone for us in terms of the way we see the world." Chuck and Janel have always been active in their communities. Chuck is an emeritus professor at UNL. He held several positions, including Dean of Nebraska Extension. Janel spent many years in public schools working in areas of early childhood education. "It's all been about family and serving small communities," Janel said.

When it came to planning the future, the couple wanted to give back. "As we were revisiting our estate plan, one of the things we realized was, our estate plan did not reflect our values in terms of philanthropy and supporting issues and projects that we are passionate about," Chuck said. The couple decided to take another look at their will, and that was the beginning of the conversation. "What we really did next is, we said if we are going to do this, we started talking about what kinds of things were important to us, and what kinds of things reflect our values that we'd like to support longer term," Chuck said.

One area they chose to support is early childhood development. "Our children are the future," Janel said. "I always worked with kids. We both worked with kids and their creativity and passion in the way they problem-solve. We've just always invested in young minds." 4-H Youth Development is another area where Chuck and Janel want their charitable giving to go, as they both have a fond appreciation for their hometown areas. "Janel was born in Loup City, and grew up in Chadron, Norfolk and Fremont," Chuck said. "I grew up in Cozad and Lexington. So, the Nebraska Community Foundation was a logical place to think about a way to invest some of our estate to help support rural communities across Nebraska."

Chuck and Janel decided to use the tools available through NCF to help them make decisions. They approached the now-retired Director of Advancement and Gift Planning, Jim Gustafson to discuss those tools. "We talked about what is the nature of philanthropy, in terms of how you do the work," Chuck said. "Is it a charitable remainder trust? Is it a charitable fund? What is the vehicle, and what choices do we have? Jim also really helped us think about the tax consequences of the choices we were making. He helped us understand that using our tax-deferred funds to support this charitable work was an advantage to us, so that was incredibly valuable." NCF also helped Chuck and Janel find key experts to get the ball rolling. "As we got to the point where we knew what we wanted to do, we found people who knew how to do it," Chuck said. "We didn't have to worry about the legal language, so we could focus on our priorities and values, and what we wanted to accomplish."

"It wasn't hard, it just took some time, because we were very deliberate in what we were doing," Janel said. "All along the way, we visited with our kids, and let them know what we were trying to do, and we updated them." Now, Chuck and Janel Hibberd have a plan. "We



decided to commit 20% of our estate to charity," Chuck said. "That 20% will go to the Nebraska Community Foundation, and they will manage the Hibberd Charitable Fund for us. Once we are deceased, 50% of the annual earnings of that fund will stay with NCF for their priorities. 25% will go to the Nebraska 4-H Foundation to support 4-H Youth Development, and 25% will go to the 4-H Youth Foundation to support the early childhood development program at the University of Nebraska."

Chuck and Janel hope others will consider charitable gift planning. "I think the big thing is to spend some time talking about what is important to you," Chuck said. "Certainly, you want to take care of your family, and you want to take care of your kids. But, are there other priorities you want to focus on? Spend some time, dig in, and find some people who know about those areas who can help you learn more. If you actually do this, how would the money be used?" Both Chuck and Janel say Nebraska Community Foundation is a good place to get your questions answered and start the conversation.
