



#### \*Robert F. Lute II Endowed Scholarship established September 30, 1993, with \$20,000

Lute was a teacher, lawyer and accountant and had a love for young people and a tremendous respect for education. The foundation became a way for him to unite the two. "Education was very important to both of us," Kathy Lute said. "Robert knew that education was necessary and not just any type of education. He felt that students needed brawn and brains. He discussed it with me before his death. He wanted money put into a good foundation." Lute's father, Robert Sr., and Kathy, Lute's widow, established an endowed scholarship in Lute's name after his death.




# Frank & \*Shirley Sibert Endowed Scholarship established May 15, 1995, with \$20,000

Vance earned many awards and was known world wide for cattle while always striving to produce herd sires that would improve the Angus breed. He was a strong supporter of youth and never




\*Bill Heller Endowed Scholarship established October 14, 1996, with \$20,000


#### Ron & Shirley Huss Endowed Scholarship established in December 2012 with \$25,000




# \*Colonel Melvin Huss

# Jim & \*Helen Gran Endowed Scholarship established in 2016, with \$25,000

Jim Gran established the Jim and Helen Gran Endowed Scholarship Account to honor his late wife Helen and his contributions to the Beef Industry in Nebraska. Both were lifelong ranchers and strong advocates for the Nebraska Beef Industry working locally and on the state level in various leadership positions. This endowed scholarship account will provide a scholarship of at least \$1,000 to a sophomore level student at NCTA majoring in an area of production agriculture and preparing for a career in production agriculture.



# \*Shari Flaming Endowed Scholarship established in 2021 with \$26,500

The Shari Flaming Memorial Scholarship was established from a planned gift. Shari was a teacher, a cattle feeder, a rancher, a fabulous cook and a lifelong Nebraska agriculture enthusiast. Shari was active in the Nebraska Cattlewomen, the Nebraska Cattlemen Foundation and was instrumental in organizing the first Nebraska Cattlemen Ball. This account will award scholarships to students residing in Nebraska, majoring in animal science, feedlot management and/or range management. Students must be involved in student organizations related to their field of study. Students much have a 3.3 GPA and preference will be given to those with cattle industry involvement.

#### Western Nebraska Agriculture Scholarship

**Endowed Scholarship** *established in 2021 with \$25,000* 

The Western Nebraska Agriculture Scholarship will be awarded to students pursuing an education following high school at an accredited higher learning institution in Nebraska, Colorado, Wyoming and/or South Dakota and majoring in agriculture. Students must have a home address located in the Mountain Time Zone in Nebraska. Preference will be given to students attending a two-year institution, community colleges, trade school and/or Chadron State College in Chadron, Nebraska.

#### \*Dr. Jeff Fox

Endowed Scholarship established in 2021 with \$28,000

Dr. Jeff Fox ran his own feedlot consulting business, Bovine Veterinary Management Resources, LLC, out of Beemer, serving clients in three states. He served as the vice chair for the Nebraska Cattlemen's Animal Health and Nutrition Committee. Weston Svoboda was the 2024 Nebraska Beef State Scholar. He is the son of Jennifer Svoboda of Burwell.

Weston will be a senior at the University of Nebraska – Lincoln this fall, majoring in ag economics and looking to get his Juris Doctor (JD) from University of Nebraska Law School.

"I have often heard it said that our purpose is the place where our dreams and passions collide. For me, I knew that was pointing me in the direction of agricultural law since I was an elementary student. As a fifth generation Nebraska rancher, the beef industry has been at the center of my life since day one. Growing up on a ranch is more than a business, it is a way of life. The rural Nebraska lifestyle equipped me with work ethic, communication skills and perseverance that are central to the person I am today. Thus, I seek a career that will allow me to give back to the place, industry and people who have given so much to me. #### Spotlight on the Frist Beef State Winner – Curtis Wetovick

Curtis Wetovick of Fullerton, Nebraska, was the first Beef State Scholarship recipient awarded in 2015. After graduating from the University of Nebraska – Lincoln with a degree in Animal Science/ Business Focus and a minor in entrepreneurship, Wetovick returned home to his family farm/ranch operation. His entrepreneurial passions lie in beef cattle production and auctioneering. He immediately started actively growing his Black Angus based cowherd and his career in marketing. He worked the ring for several years before getting a chance to get behind the mic as an auctioneer, where he showed his true talent. His rhythmic chant and charisma awarded him the 2017 Nebraska Auctioneer Association Bid Calling Champion. Weekly Curtis cries bids at four sale barns in two states, along with other contract jobs. "I am very busy with the auctioneering business and I love it. I am also growing my cowherd and backgrounding/yearling business, "said Wetovick. "Agriculture has so many opportunities for young people but you gotta get out and make it happen. Don't' worry if you don't have the fanciest facilities or equipment. Focus on the things that matter. Also stay involved in industry organizations and advocate for less government in agriculture and do not support policies that make the big, bigger. Work hard and keep livestock on the land."



#### History

The Nebraska Beef Industry Endowment was established in December 2009. It will provide grants to beef industry-related research and/ or teaching positions at Nebraska post-secondary educational institutions. This award will serve as a thank you and an incentive to those professors/instructors that are providing cutting edge research and/or student instruction in a beef industry related area. This grant will help fund valuable research that might not occur otherwise or allow the continuation of research already being conducted that might not continue because of lack of funding and/ or reward a professor/instructor for outstanding educational instruction to their students.

Since 1968, the Nebraska Cattlemen Foundation has supported the beef industry by financially supporting research and educational projects/programs. Early on the Foundation was instrumental in prompting

research in the area of calf-scours and center pivot irrigation and more recently providing funding for the new research feedlot at the Panhandle Research Center in Scottsbluff and the new educational facilities at the Nebraska College of Technical Agriculture in Curtis. Funding scholarships has always been important for the Foundation with thousands of dollars in scholarships awarded to hundreds of students from numerous endowed scholarships accounts and other sources.

The Nebraska Cattlemen Foundation established the Nebraska Beef Industry Professorship of Animal Science at UNL in December 1994 with \$200,000. This fund allows an annual stipend of \$10,000 to be awarded to a worthy professor with the University of Nebraska College of Agriculture and Natural Resources.

The Nebraska Cattlemen Foundation wanted to duplicate that effort and create a fund that would not be limited

just to UNL, but benefit a post-secondary educational institution and/or teaching position any where in our great state of Nebraska, thus the Nebraska Beef Industry Endowment was created. The board plans to grant up to \$5,000 annually to an outstanding professor/instructor.

The Nebraska Beef Industry Endowment was endowed with \$100,000. Drewnoski received a \$6,000 grant.



This award will serve as a thank you and an incentive to those professors/instructors that are providing cutting edge research and/or student instruction in a range management and conservation related area.

This endowment was created from one-half the net proceeds of the 2010-2011 Retail Value Steer Challenge. The Nebraska Cattlemen Foundation voted to move enough money from the general account to fully endow the Nebraska Range & Conservation Endowment at \$100,000 at their September 17, 2013, board meeting.

#### Nebraska Beef Cattle Industry Professorship

The Nebraska Beef Cattle Industry Professorship of Animal Science at UNL was established in December 1994 with \$200,000. This fund allows an annual stipend of \$10,000 to be awarded to a worthy professor within the University of Nebraska College Agriculture and Natural Resources. Dr. Chris Calkins was awarded this stipend from 1995 – 2011. The Nebraska Cattlemen Foundation proudly awarded Dr. Galen Erickson this stipend in 2012 for his cutting edge research with feedlot rations, especially the use of distillers grain and other by-product feed sources in finishing diets for beef cattle. Erickson will receive this award through July 1, 2027.

#### **UNL Feedlot Management Course**

The Foundation funds a grant each year since 1997 to support the UNL Feedlot Management Course. This fund was established with \$20,000 from the Merck-Merial Generations of Excellence funds. This course is an intensive eight week study on and off campus that provides students an opportunity to get real life experience in the feedlot industry, including internships at feedlots.

# Lee Weide Retires From Nebraska Cattlemen

For an organization to be successful, it needs talented, committed, hardworking individuals who ride for the brand. For the last 27 years, that individual has been Lee Weide and the organizations have been Nebraska Cattlemen (NC) and its related entities of Nebraska Cattlemen Research and Education Foundation (NC Foundation), Nebraska Corn Fed Beef (NCFB), NC Market Reporting Service (MRS) and the NC Beef Pit. Weide retired from Nebraska Cattlemen at the end of 2023 to move on to the next chapter of his life.

Since 1997, Weide has been a faithful and dedicated colleague, serving the Nebraska Cattlemen membership with professionalism and commitment in almost every possible capacity. The list of Weide's responsibilities is extensive and worth noting to fully appreciate his contributions to Nebraska Cattlemen.

Weide started with Nebraska Cattlemen in early 1997 with the member-driven Nebraska Corn Fed Beef program, first as database coordinator and then as director. His responsibilities to NCFB were extensive in the beginning days of this value-added program. Weide's talents then allowed for a transition to analyst for the NC Market Reporting Service, then to NC director of feedlot member services and eventually NC vice president of member services. In 2006, Weide became vice president of operations, a position he held until his retirement. His responsibilities under that title effectively encompassed nearly all activities servicing NC membership.

In addition to his duties with Nebraska Cattlemen, beginning in 2005 Weide served as staff liaison to the NC Research and Education Foundation. In this role, he worked closely with the staff at Darr Feedlot where the annual NC Foundation Retail Value Steer Challenge (RVSC) is held. Weide maintained the highest level of detailed data management of cattle for members and contributors throughout each RVSC. The turnaround time from the end of the RVSC to the NC Midyear Meeting where the results were shared and winners announced was always demanding. but Weide always delivered the results completely and on time.

Beginning in 2000, Weide took on the important role of managing the Nebraska Cattlemen Beef Pit at the Nebraska State Fair, an exceptionally high-visibility and vital NC function. Weide and his wife, Jennifer, put in countless hours each year, coordinating and organizing the many volunteers who worked the Beef Pit, coordinating with Daryl and Maggie Griepenstroh to help prepare and cook the meat, and working with the State Fair vendors, leadership and staff to ensure that consumers always had an exceptional meal at the State Fair. The Beef Pit has been the leading food vendor at the Nebraska State Fair for many years.

For 15 years, Weide organized all facets of both the Nebraska Cattlemen Annual Convention and Trade Show, typically held in Kearney, and the NC Midyear meeting, held in a location near the current president. Planning and executing these events require a great deal of coordination with the NC Board of Directors, staff, members, vendors and facilities, and Weide's expertise was critical to the success of these events.

Weide's most significant contribution to the Nebraska Cattlemen might well be his role in making 4611 Cattle Drive in Lincoln NC's permanent home. Weide was essentially the on-staff general contractor on virtually every detail, from fundraising to identifying and securing the building site and working with the builders to oversee the construction, all the way to decorating and executing the move-in. His close work with builders Mark and Dave Masek made the member-owned building in Lincoln a reality. There were numerous challenges along the way, but Weide's diligence and ownership of the

process made a substantial difference that came to fruition in February 2019 when operations at the new office commenced. Weide deserves significant recognition and thanks for this effort.

Weide and Jennifer met while students at Kansas State University where he earned a degree in animal science. He then attended the University of Nebraska-Lincoln where he received a master's degree in meat science. He and Jennifer have two sons, Ryan and Kyle.

In a day and age where moving from one job to another is commonplace, it is important to acknowledge and honor a talented, loyal member servant such as Lee Weide. Many in Nebraska have greatly benefited from his efforts! Nebraska Cattlemen wishes Weide and his family the very best in the future.
